BROTHER ISIDORE SCHOLARSHIP FUND



This Scholarship Fund for religious vocations was established in 1979 in honor of Brother Isidore Wasylenchuk---a dedicated Christian Brother.

He left Yorkton after some twenty years of service to students of this area as a teacher at St. Joseph's College and a division of the University of Saskatchewan in Yorkton for 1st year Arts and Science. To commemorate these years of dedication, the Knights of Columbus in Yorkton and area, Yorkton Council #2031, Father Delaere Council #5182 and Brother Stanislaus Assembly #1286 pledged \$200.00 a year. When the capital produced enough interest a \$300.00 scholarship was awarded to any student undertaking religious studies and training needed for religious life at a Catholic University or Catholic Theological College or Institution.

The eligibility at that time was that a student must be a resident of the area covered by the jurisdictions of the Brother Stanislaus Assembly which includes the sponsoring Yorkton Councils #2031, #5182, as well as thje following councils: Melville #5201, Esterhazy #5949, Ituna #5320, Langenburg #5408, Canora #5861, Grayson #5965, Foam Lake #5970 and Kamsack #6132,

In 1988 the scholarship was increased to \$500.00 due to the drop in applications, but since 1994 the interest would not keep up with demand so applications were screened by the committee and some candidates were passed on to Fr. Delaere and Yorkton Councils to pick up the slack.

It was then that the K of C Supreme office initiated the *Vocation Rebate Program* in which the councils would receive \$100.00 from Supreme for each \$500.00 scholarship given out. Then all scholarships were processed through this program with Councils #2031 and #5182 receiving the rebates.

In 1997, due to a drop in applications, the eligibility area was extended to include all seminarians from the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Regina, The Roman Catholic Diocese of Saskatoon and the Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy of Saskatoon. Since that time, the Yorkton Council, Father Delaere Council and Brother Isidore Scholarship Fund have been giving out a minimum of six scholarships per year. Any access of applications that were received, were given to the State Board to find councils who are participating in the Rebate Program.

To date, seventy scholarships have been given out with nine of the recipients being ordained a priest, three as deacons to date and five are still attending a seminary. The highest number of scholarships to one recipient was six. The recipients for 2005 were as follows: Brother Raphael Derrow from Canora attending Newman Theology College in Edmonton; Deacon Yurij Lazurko from Canora attending Holy Spirit Ukrainian Seminary in Ottawa; Lloyd Zyla from Weyburn, Interning at St. Anne's Parish in Saskatoon; Mathew Ramsay from St. Benedict Sask, at Mount Angel Seminary in Oregon, U.S.A.; Andrew Korvemaker of Regina, interning at St. Gerard's Parish in Yorkton; Louis Kim Nguyen of Regina Achdiocese, at St. Peter's Seminary in London, Ontario.
