DISTRICT DEPUTY'S MESSAGE

Congratulations to all the Councils in District # 11 who completed and sent in and met their deadline regarding the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity (# 1728); also the semi-annual Council Audit Report (# 1295). My District Deputy's Semi-Annual Report on Council Status (# 944A council evaluation report) was sent in by December 31, 2006. I am pleased to report that all Councils in my district have attained a passing grade. Keep up the good work---send in your monthly reports on time and all our requirement will be met.

By the time this report reaches your Council, the Basketball Free Throw Competition will have been completed. Congratulations to all Councils who held their Council Free Throw in January. Thanks to Councils # 2031 and # 5182 who hosted the District Free Throw Competition on February 18th in Yorkton. Our appreciation is extended to the newly named Fr. Hendrick Boels Council # 5320 in Ituna who accepted to host the zone Basketball Free Throw on March 10th, 2007. Congratulations to all the workers, the competitors and the winners who will move on to the Provincial Competition.

At this time a number of important announcements have to be mentioned so that all Councils are aware of what their responsibilities are. I hope that each Council in our District holds some sort of event to observe the 125th Anniversary on March 29, 2007 in recognition of Founder's Day. You may host an Anniversary Mass and an appreciation event to show that the Knights of Columbus stands "In Solidarity With Our Priests".

The Saskatchewan State Council is holding its 85th Annual State Convention on April 13, 14 &15, 2007 in Saskatoon. I encourage all Grand Knights and delegates to register and attend this important event. A province wide convention will give you a broader view of what the Knights of Columbus do in Saskatchewan.

Mention must be made at this time that there will be no Major Degree Exemplification in District #11. For whatever reason, our Councils are reluctant to host a Major Degree. I know that each Council may have only one or two candidates but these may have to wait till the fall or perhaps decide to attend Regina or Saskatoon in May and June, who will be hosting Major Degrees.

When you look at the calendar, April, May and June, how quickly the year comes to an end and yet there is so much to do. We have to look at year-end activities and new executive positions and service program directors plus election of officers and yet it seems we just got started.

Looking ahead to the fall, the year 2007 will mark a significant milestone in the history of Columbianism in the Saskatchewan State jurisdiction. Knights and their families will celebrate 100th Anniversary of our Order's arrival in our province. The first Council in Saskatchewan Council # 1274 in Regina will be hosting a major dinner at the Centre of the Arts on October 27, 2007, along with a Mass, a quest speaker and a formal banquet.

Each Council is Saskatchewan should in some way observe this 100th Anniversary. Some examples may be to form a committee to celebrate this event. You may involve your Church Director, Council Activities, Public Relations Director and Community Director to plan this celebration in your Council. Whatever it is, you are also encouraged to attend the celebration in Regina October 27, 2007.

You have heard time and again about membership recruitment and I am aware of all the problems and difficulties in attaining our quota for each Council, but we cannot give-up. I want to quote our Supreme Knight and his request. "It is our shared duty, as leaders of the Order, to work tirelessly to recruit new men into the Knights of Columbus. The reason we must work so hard is not, however, just to satisfy a quota; we need more dedicated brother Knights to continue and increase our charitable work, for the good of the Church and communities".

With the approach of the Easter season, we need to first of all, recognize what Lent is and what we are required to do about it. We know that Lent is a season of fasting and penance. The Great Fast is a time of change---opening our hearts to the Holy Spirit that He might transform us. Intentionally or through human weakness, some of our actions or lack thereof affect or even hurt others or deprive others of their fullest potential

for growth in love and service. With the Lenten season and the approach of Easter it is a great way to prepare and a great opportunity to re-examine oneself and make changes to deepen our faith and rectify some differences. Furthermore, the main reason for Lent is repentance over our sins and we need to forgive others and ask for their forgiveness. Christ died for our sins; his Resurrection; has given us hope. "Christ has Risen! Indeed He has Risen!

On behalf of my wife Edna and myself, we want to wish everyone a Blessed and a Holy Easter.
