Procedure for transferring:

A member in possession of a current membership card may transfer to any council of his choice by making an application on a form 100. The receiving council accepts the application for transfer under the elective procedures. (Note: the transfer is initiated only by the receiving council.) Upon receipt of the transfer application, the Supreme Council office will immediately transfer the applicant to the new council. (For Honorary and Honorary Life members, new plastic cards will be issued.)
