



These motions included;

■ An annual Novena to Our Lady of Guadalupe for an end to abortions

■ A call of funds to be set aside to prevent the legislation of Assisted Suicide and Euthanasia

■ That the State Council continue to subsidize bus transportation to the Annual March for Life on the grounds of the Legislative Building in Regina

■ A call for Knights to not only financially support Pro-Life organizations but also become more physically supportive of these groups.

■ That the Knights of Columbus address the issues of Bill # 384 and insist that the Federal Government consider just and humane alternatives to assisted suicide and euthanasia.
